

What is a peer mediator?

- A **Peer** is a fellow classmate.
- A **Mediator** is a person who is a helper. They help people to resolve any disagreements they have with each other

We have 8 Peer Mediators in school from Years 4, 5 and 6



What they do:

- Our Peer mediators help their classmates involved in a disagreement, discuss their issues and explore ways to resolve them.
- They support staff in leading solution circles.
- They facilitate restorative conversations, ensuring that all parties involved have a chance to be heard and express their views.
- They encourage their peers to actively listen to each other and communicate their needs and feelings.
- They help their peers to identify root causes of the conflict and brainstorm potential solutions that address everyone's needs.
- Peer mediators meet with Mrs Adeogun throughout the year and have led on assemblies for the whole school on ways to resolve conflict and strategies to manage big emotions like anger.
- Peer mediators support the running of the Wednesday lunchtime Wellbeing club.
- They share information in class around positive wellbeing.
- They have created worry boxes for all classes, so children have another space to share worries. Peer mediators will help some of their peers with their worries.
