		<p>come into contact with others and are supervised at all times.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The parents of unwell pupils are informed as soon as possible of the situation by the Inclusion team. • Where contact with a pupil's parents cannot be made, appropriate procedures are followed in accordance with those outlined in governmental guidance. • Unwell pupils who are waiting to go home are kept in an area where they can be at least two metres away from others. • Areas used by unwell staff and pupils who need to go home are appropriately cleaned once vacated, using a disinfectant and care to be taken when cleaning all hard surfaces. • If unwell pupils and staff are waiting to go home, they are instructed to use different toilets to the rest of the school to minimise the spread of infection. • Any pupils who display signs of infection are taken home immediately, or as soon as practicable, by their parents – the parents are advised to contact NHS 111 immediately or call 999 if the pupil becomes seriously ill or their life is at risk. • Any members of staff who display signs of infection are sent home immediately and are advised to contact NHS 111 immediately or call 999 if they become seriously ill or their life is at risk. • Any medication given to ease the unwell individual's symptoms, e.g. Paracetamol, is administered in accordance with the Administering Medications Policy.

Positive Cases	Pupils Staff	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • School no longer need to do contact tracing as close contacts will be identified via NHS Test and Trace. • School will support NHS Test and Trace when required to help identify close contacts • Children under the age of 18 years old will no longer be required to self-isolate if they are contacted by NHS Test and Trace as a close contact of a positive COVID-19 case. • Instead, children will be contacted by NHS Test and Trace, informed they have been in close contact with a positive case and advised to take a PCR test. • We would encourage all individuals to take a PCR test if advised to do so. • Staff / Pupils with a positive lateral flow test result should self-isolate in line with the stay at home guidance and get a PCR test to check if they have COVID-19 and continue to self-isolate • If the PCR test is taken within 2 days of the positive lateral flow test, and is negative, it overrides the self-test and the pupils/staff can return to school as long as the individual doesn't have COVID-19 symptoms 	MED

		<p>return to school after having coronavirus – the school informs the relevant staff.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Caretakers monitor the cleaning standards of school cleaning contractors and discusses any additional measures required with regards to managing the spread of coronavirus. <p>Contingency framework: education and childcare settings (publishing.service.gov.uk)</p> <p>The thresholds, detailed below, will be used by BHPS as an indication for when to seek public health advice if they are concerned.</p> <p>For most education and childcare settings, whichever of these thresholds is reached first:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ 5 children, pupils, students or staff, who are likely to have mixed closely, test positive for COVID-19 within a 10-day period: or ➤ 10% of children, pupils, students or staff who are likely to have mixed closely test positive for COVID-19 within a 10-day period <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We will seek public health advice if a pupil, student, child or staff member is admitted to hospital with COVID-19 by phoning the DfE helpline (0800 046 8687, option 1), or in line with other local arrangements. Hospitalisation could indicate increased severity of illness or a new variant of concern. Settings may be offered public health support in managing risk assessments and communicating with staff and parents. • The School may seek additional public health advice if they are concerned about transmission in the setting.

Admitting people into school	Pupils Staff	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pupils, staff and other adults should not come into school if they have symptoms, have had a positive test result or have been instructed to quarantine • Any staff or pupils within the school who appear to have COVID-19 symptoms are sent home, advised to avoid using public transport and, wherever possible, be collected by a member of their family or household and to follow public health advice • In the case of a pupil awaiting collection, they should be taken to a room away from other pupils and supervised • If the member of staff is in close contact with the child then they should wear appropriate PPE • Any rooms that have been used for this purpose should be cleaned after they have left 	MED
